Access-Identify and define food access-Food deserts, and food data maps; need to touch with asset mapping-To become more inclusive-Youth empowerment-Meeting Tuesday 2/28-No funding needs

Emergency Food Flow/Food Crisis Cluster-To help the community get over a food crisis that is either long or short term-Information gathering, sharing-Education awareness-Policy-Preparedness, community building-Gaps identified from the emergency services of buncombe county-Points of distribution, nothing inside the city limits-Need to organize the needs of each neighborhood-Mark: Department of homeland security-Funding: facilities, storage, climate controlled?

Local Food Flow-Barriers:access to land, urban and rural, funding tools, tool-shares, regulation and distribution, becoming producers (resources for that also), and processors-Will be addressing policies soon-Lack of processing facilities-A lot of micro-producers, which becomes wasteful in resources and time-Funding not needed yet

Policy Legislative-Meet twice-Assisting other clusters with policy needs-Proactive in informing other clusters-Advocating policy to stakeholders-Want clusters to come to them for help with writing, and addressing policies needed for proposal-Policies: House and senate bill-local food and farms act Sending letter on behalf of FPC in support of the bill-Important for to communicate the clusters!-Any policy that is about to be sent to the government
